Why is this relevant to me?

- Huge advances in technology
- Don't get left behind
- Significant opportunity for efficiency and costs saving in planning environment
 - E-lodgement
 - 3D Perspectives
 - Virtual reality models
 - Record keeping/reporting/consultation





Context

- Concept of urban planning is not new
- Planning frameworks are continually developing
- Use of technology in planning is more common place
- Planning profession is more specialised than ever



The real reason...

- The planning process has its problems
- Principle issue arises from a dispute/difference of opinion in assessment
- Discretion
 - Defined as 'the freedom to decide what should be done in a particular situation'
 - Based in statutory power to make judgements
- Issue
 - How that power is used and controlled



Discretion

- Successful exercise of discretion is balance of:
 - aligning planning decisions; with
 - particular planning objectives; and
 - considering multiple related interests
- Good judgement is:
 - diversity and quality of inputs made deliberatively
 - as opposed to individual intuition

- If the point of view/idea/proposal is not conveyed effectively...

Issues


- Technical capacity
